Appendix - Affordable Housing Definition

Affordable housing is social rented, affordable rented and intermediate housing, provided to eligible households whose needs are not met by the market. Eligibility is determined with regard to local incomes and local house prices. From April 2012 affordable housing is defined in the National Planning Policy Framework (prior to this the definitions in Planning Policy Statement 3 apply).

Affordable housing should include provisions to remain at an affordable price for future eligible households or for the subsidy to be recycled for alternative affordable housing provision.

Affordable rented housing is let by local authorities or private registered providers of social housing to households who are eligible for social rented housing. Affordable rent is subject to rent controls that require a rent of no more than 80 per cent of the local market rent (including service charges, where applicable).

Hockley Heath Parish Council will apply additional criteria as follows:

1. Parish of Hockley Heath

- a. A current resident of the Parish of Hockley Heath who has lived in the Parish for a minimum of 2 years;
- b. Born in the Parish of Hockley Heath and previously resident in the Parish for more than 2 years;
- c. Past resident of the Parish of Hockley Heath having lived there for a minimum of 2 years;
- d. Close relatives currently resident in the Parish of Hockley Heath and have done for a minimum of 2 years. Close relatives are defined as parents, children, brothers or sisters, grand parents or grandchildren;
- e. Currently has permanent employment in the Parish of Hockley Heath which they have held for at least 2 years (employer reference required); and
- f. A need to reside in the Parish either to provide care/support or to be cared for/supported by another member of their family who has lived in the Parish for a minimum of 2 years (medical reference required).

2. Solihull Council Wards of Dorridge and Hockley Heath; Knowle

As above A-F, but for the Council Wards of Dorridge and Hockley Heath; Knowle

3. Anyone on the housing register.
